NOTES:

1) For purposes of reporting, recruiting publications, and general descriptions of WVU, and/or unless otherwise indicated, the Student/ Faculty ratio is defined as "General University Undergraduate Student FTE/ General University Instructional Faculty FTE."

2) Instructional faculty (AAUP definition) = primary assignment of Academic Tenure Track or Instruction Non-Tenure Track (i.e. Adjunct, Visiting, Clinical, S/M)

3) Includes Chairs with academic rank.

4) In new IPEDS defined Fall 2008 ratio, collected by IPEDS in Spring 2009, the FTE of all students was included except those enrolled in graduate or professional programs such as medicine, law, veterinary, dentistry, social work, or public health, in which faculty teach virtually only graduate-level students. Faculty FTE include all non-medical instructional faculty except those enrolled in graduate or professional programs such as medicine, law, veterinary, dentistry, social work, or public health, in which faculty teach virtually only graduate-level students.
